Safety Standards

Our safety standards include strict protocols to ensure the campus remains secure. All doors remained locked, and a designated individual is responsible for overseeing the lockdown of the facility. Administrators are regularly walking the building to monitor and ensure the safety of the campus. Additionally, every classroom is equipped with a walkie-talkie, allowing for immediate communication..

Compassion & Grace

In all we do, we will relate to one another with an open heart, an understanding mind, and the will to empathize with one another in love. We will seek to listen with patience, extend forgiveness freely, and support each other through both joys and challenges. Navigation

We recognize that mishaps, mistakes, and misunderstandings will occur, and we commit to navigating them with a re-directive approach, using kind and encouraging words and actions to create learning opportunities. Camaraderie

Built on strong bonds of support, trust, and shared purpose among the women who teach and lead at Agape we are a community where we uplift one another, offer encouragement, understanding, and care in both personal and professional aspects. Through collaboration, prayer, and a commitment to each other's growth, we foster an environment where women feel valued, supported, and empowered, all while modeling grace, love, and unity for the children and families we serve.

Tuition

Annual tuition is based on a family unit of up to 5 members, (Mom + four children) totaling \$300. For families with more than four children, an additional \$100 per child will be applied. Tuition must be paid in full by August 1st of the same year co'op begins. We offer a three-week grace period to ensure Agapé is the right fit for your family.

Pods

The following Pods remain in their assigned classrooms throughout the day, with the exception of playground time and lunch.

Scouts (age recommendation infant - 2yrs)

Our youngest learners are lovingly cared for in a nurturing environment that supports early development through gentle interaction, sensory play, music, activities, and story time. The Scouts class is designed to reflect the heart of Agape—building trust, joy, and connection from the very start. With a focus on consistency and comfort, our teachers partner with parents to ensure each child feels secure and cherished throughout the day.

Expectations:

- Parents provide all necessary items (diapers, bottles, snacks).
- Bring anything essential for nap time
- Separation anxiety is normal and handled with love and care.

Shipmates (age recommendation 2yrs - 3yrs)

Our curious and energetic Shipmates begin to explore the world around them through play-based learning, music, movement, and age-appropriate faith-building activities. With gentle structure and lots of encouragement, children engage in hands-on experiences that spark creativity and lay the foundation for social, emotional, and spiritual growth. This class emphasizes routine, kindness, and discovery—all within a loving, Christ-centered environment.

Expectations:

- Working toward potty training (pull-ups allowed).
 - Able to follow basic instructions.
 - Participates in group play and structured activities with guidance.
- Can sit for short periods for story time.

Voyagers (age recommendation 4yrs - 5yrs)

Our Voyagers are ready to set sail into deeper learning! This class offers a balanced mix of structured activities and creative exploration to support early academic, social, and spiritual development. Through interactive lessons in phonics, early math, Bible stories, music, art, and movement, students begin building the skills they need for a smooth transition into more formal learning. With Christ at the center, Voyagers are encouraged to grow in confidence, kindness, and curiosity.

Expectations:

- Must be fully potty trained (no diapers or pull-ups).
 - Must be able to write their first name
 - Able to follow multi-step directions.
- Can sit and participate in structured group time (circle time, crafts, etc.).
Beginning letter and number recognition is helpful but not required.

All other Pods will rotate through each of the following classes:
Theology. Art. Science. Theater.

Sailors (age recommendation 6-7)

Expectations:

- Must be able to read and write 4 word sentences.
 - Able to listen & participate respectfully in class discussions and activities.
 - Can complete simple tasks independently (cutting, gluing, following)
- Basic reading is expected.

Deckies (age recommendation 8-9)

Expectations:

- Read independently.
- Able to follow written and verbal instructions.
- Demonstrates growing responsibility and focus.
- Can work cooperatively in small group settings.

Writing short sentences is expected.

Bosun (age recommendation 10-12)

Expectations:

- Can complete written assignments independently.
- Demonstrates respectful behavior and leadership among younger students.
- Participates actively in discussions and hands-on learning.

Strong reading comprehension and writing is encouraged

Crew (age recommendation 13+)

Expectations:

- Models Christ-like behavior and maturity.
- Capable of managing time, completing projects, & support peers
- Actively participates in deep discussions, critical thinking exercises
- Willing to serve and mentor younger students.

Classes

Theology

This class is designed to help students understand the teachings of Jesus through His parables. Each parable reveals deep truths about God, His Kingdom, and what it means to be a disciple of Christ. Through reading, discussion, and practical applications, students will grow in their faith and learn how to live as followers of Jesus.

By studying the parables, students will:

- Discover who Jesus is and why He came.
- Develop a heart that reflects Christ's teachings.
- Learn how to live daily as disciples.

Be equipped to share their faith with others.

Art

This class will nurture creativity and visual storytelling as students explore the themes of Jesus' parables. Through hands-on art projects, students will:

Reflect on biblical truths through visual expression.

Build foundational to advanced art skills over time.

Create meaningful art that reinforces spiritual growth and discipleship.

Science

This class is designed to connect fundamental scientific concepts with the teachings of Jesus through His parables. By exploring topics in chemistry, physics, biology, and earth science, students will see how science reflects spiritual truths. Hands-on experiments, discussions, and practical applications will reinforce both scientific understanding and biblical lessons.

By studying science through the lens of Jesus' parables, students will:

- Develop an appreciation for God's design in creation.
- Understand how scientific principles align with biblical truths.

Engage in hands-on experiments that bring learning to life.

Theater

This class uses the parables of Jesus as a foundation for teaching theatrical skills. Students will learn drama through movement, voice, improvisation, character study, and performance. Lessons build weekly to strengthen confidence, teamwork, and biblical reflection.

By studying theater through the lens of Jesus' parables, students will:

- Grow in self-awareness and communication.
 - Use storytelling to reflect gospel truths.
 - Develop acting skills such as stage presence, emotional expression, and voice control.
 - Collaborate with peers to bring Scripture to life.
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
